-- The Pastor's Corner --

My brothers and sisters in Christ, The Resurrection of the Lord Paul Turner wrote that "Time disappears when someone we love is dying. Day cedes to night without much notice. Activities we have promised to do we discard instead, like the sweater we doff on a slowly warming afternoon. Routines we never break cease. Something else has taken our attention, is sitting in our brain, has bound our legs and lowered our head. Nothing else is important but this person who gave meaning to our life and whose threatened passing wicks away the confidence that hitherto steadied our days. Yet no death completely surprises, and each one bestows a deeper understanding of the meaning of life".

Paraphrasing Mr. Turner's words from Glory in the Cross: Holy Week in the Third Edition of the Roman Missal, he goes on to state that Holy Week invited

each of us into the emotional experience of loss, fear, and redemption. We have had 40 days to remember the One who died for us; we accompanied Him on the road to Calvary, paying particular attention to each of His words and actions, discovering anew our love for the one who was lost and the joy of one who returned.

Following the long, dark, cold, virtually lifeless, somber season of Lent, the celebration of the Triduum liturgies and the Resurrection of the Lord, seems to be a perfect opportunity to give thanks for all of God's blessings. An olde hymn perhaps says it best with the lyrics, "When I think about the goodness of Jesus, and all He has done for me, my soul cries halleluiah! Thank God for the victory". Think about it for a minute. By God's grace and mercy we have borne our trials, wandered in the desert, carried our crosses, survived the times of tribulation and now we celebrate Easter jov. Yes I will acknowledge that I am stretching parameters of our Easter joy to make a particular point, but I think you will all understand. It is my hope and prayer that your celebration now has not precluded you from noticing the flyers. bulletin board, and lector announcements of our upcoming American Red Cross Blood Drive. On the Monday following our celebration of God's Divine Mercy (08 April 2013) from 12:00 PM until 5:45 PM our parish will sponsor a blood drive. Think about this for just a second or two. Jesus shed His Precious Blood for each of us, and now, rather, just one week and a day from now, we are asking that you would make time to not shed your blood, but in a perfect safe, comfortable environment, give some of your blood, so that others might live. To jumpstart our new annual tradition of helping to recycle life by the donation of blood, any individual who is 17 years of age or older should make a profound effort to show that our faith is not without works. Remember that by registering and/or showing up to make a donation we are following the example of Christ, who shed His blood for us, we will give our blood for the health and wellbeing of our brothers and sisters. I remain totally confident that within communities such as ours, there exists a sufficient number of medically able bodied individuals who can make this effort a success. I am asking you to be inspired by the blood Jesus shed for you, the mercy and forgiveness He offers to

you, and the proclamation of His Word, to move you to donate blood. I will close with just a little food for

Jesus had to walk the lonesome valley all by Himself. Nobody else could walk it for Him. Yet, willingly He went to the cross and shed His blood. Now as we share in the joy that the strife is over and the battle is done, the victory of life won. now that the powers of death have done their worst, but Christ their legions has dispersed, now that He has closed the yawning gates of hell, and the bars from heaven's high portal fell, now that from the grave He was seen alive, I'll see you all next Monday, at the Queen of Peace Blood Drive.
