-- The Pastor's Corner --

My brothers and sisters in Christ, I have been moved this week to what I would like to describe as a righteous anger because of the way Holy Mother Church is being depicted in the media. I have wanted to overturn my satellite dish and beat most of the news reporters with a whip of cords because of their incredulous stories. In fact, in one report, a well know Protestant minister, namely Bishop T.D. Jekes, was being interviewed about the process of the Pope's resignation and the gathering of the conclave to elect the new Pope. I wondered what could some Protestant minister say about the Holy Father's resignation which could not be better articulated by any of the Bishops of any of the Catholic dioceses here in the United States or from anywhere else? I wondered why each spokesperson for Catholicism had to be some disgruntled, disgraced, former Catholic priest, one who had left Catholicism to become an Episcopalian minister, in order to get married; and who of course feels celibacy should be optional for clergy. The Roman Catholic Church is not a democracy! We are directed not only by the working of the Holy Spirit, but also by what are called ecclesiastical laws. Those individuals who wish not to adhere to the teachings and instructions of Holy Mother Church are free to find their spiritual needs serviced in other places or denominations. However, the Roman Catholic Church, with more than a two thousand year history is not going to amend how she operates because "Joe

Blow" feels it should do something his way.

Admittedly, the Church still must confront head on the issue of the priest sex abuse scandals. As abusive priests are purged from ministry, and individuals who were abused prayerfully heal, Holy Mother Church still stands as a beacon, a refuge, and an ever present help in times of trouble.

In my recent exhortation to all of you to stand firm in the faith by your practice of the faith, I have been pleasantly inspired that you have heard my call. I am impressed that many of you are making a more profound effort to believe what is being taught through Catholicism and to more fully practice what you believe through the celebrations of the liturgies. Despite the fact that we live in a casual culture which prides itself on being such, I have noticed your recognition of the beauty of a well celebrated Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

As we offer the Holy Sacrifice this weekend the Chair of St. Peter is vacant, "Sede Vacante". Yet, we should not be discouraged. We should not lose heart. We should not even be moved to righteous anger. We should however be moved to consider in an ever more profound way, the Paschal Mystery. We should remember the cross of Jesus. We should remember the profound love He has for each of us, in spite of the weaknesses of our humanity; He loved us enough to die for us.

I would like to end this weekend's pastor's corner again with the words of Fr. Edward Steiner, who wrote: "During Lent we should work to recover the remarkable sight of the cross.

Unfortunately it is not a bush on fire yet not consumed. For many, it is not much more than decorative art or just another symbol in the church building".

"We cannot be fig trees that produce no fruit. We must sit before the cross and let it be the fertilizer that changes us. We must see pain. We must see blood. We must see suffering. If we do not, we will not grow in comprehending the depth of God's love. We must change and not let our casualness keep us from letting the cross be something that can lead to real repentance."
