-- The Pastor's Corner --

My brothers and sisters in Christ, As we mourn following yet another senseless act of violence, this time in Boston, now perhaps more than ever we must remember God's commandment to love. Let us consider the following words from Fr. Edward Steiner: "Our society is marked by conflict. Our government can barely operate because of our all-or-nothing mindset. Just as children hold out, kicking and screaming, until their parents are broken and give in to their demands, so, too, we hold people hostage by our own demands. We draw many lines in the sand. "Unfortunately this happens within the Church as well. Parishioners will leave a parish of many years if they feel they are not getting their way. Like angry consumers who feel cheated by a store, some parishioners will withhold their donations until the pastor bends to their will.

"Our first reading today acknowledges conflict. It also acknowledges that unnecessary conflict causes suffering. Taken together, our readings today are not about despair over conflict. To the contrary, they reminds us of our ability to triumph over conflict and the suffering it causes.

"Paul and Barnabas were successfully spreading the story of Jesus Christ, His passion, His death, and His resurrection. Antioch was a center of Judaism, so Paul and Barnabas went there to preach the Gospel. There was tremendous response. Acts tells us that, unfortunately, success brought conflict. "Acts says that "when the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and, with violent abuse, contradicted what Paul said." We must understand "the Jews" to mean the leaders of the synagogue and not all Jews in general. In a parish there are two types of leaders: official leaders who hold office and the "pillars of the faith" who hold no office but hold sway because of the power of their personalities. These groups were

the ones who attacked Paul and Barnabas.

"The method used to turn people against Paul and Barnabas was gossip and slander. This goes on within every area of our lives. If we do not like what we see or hear or, more realistically, if we feel threatened—justified or not – we attack the messenger. We do this often. We do it to co-workers, supervisors and bosses, politicians, family and even our priests and religious. We do not just dismiss ideas, we also dismiss people. Further and worse, truth is always the first victim of gossip.

"The Book of Revelation believes that to be truly Christian we must be different from the culture in which we live. Revelation saw that for Christians there will always be an inherent conflict with completely accommodating to society. The book of revelation sees pain because of the conflict of faith and culture, but revelation is not about the pain, it is about the solution.

"Revelation tells us about the crowd that will stand before the throne waving palm branches, a symbol of victory after war. In a word, what was the victory those before the throne achieved? Unity. Unity in Jesus Christ is the solution to human conflict. Revelation refers to efforts to achieve unity as war because the writer knows that achieving unit in Christ will not be easy. Why is it not easy? Like the leaders who attacked Paul and Barnabas, we have a hard time surrendering our will to another. We can be irredeemably self-centered. Self-centeredness always blocks unity in Christ.

"Today, we are being called to recognize Jesus' voice and Jesus' call to unity. His unity is built on His call to love God and neighbor. It is created by attitude and action. Love is a verb, and Jesus calls us to "do" for each other. This unity is very attractive and, when achieved, it is a cause for conversion and a defense against conflict.

"There is conflict and disunity between faith, culture, and society, but if we are to live truly as the sheep of the Lord's flock, we must heed His call to love Him and one another. "

May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. AMDG
