-- The Pastor's Corner --

My brothers and sisters in Christ, Last weekend when I woke and saw "reindeer feathers", more commonly known as snowflakes on the back porch, it was difficult to think of anything related to spring. However, the reality remains that spring sprung more than one month ago despite the recently chilly Michigan weather.

My family followed a tradition of doing what my mother referred to as "spring cleaning". It was that time when she would finally force me and my siblings to get rid of anything which no longer served a functional purpose. You know the things I'm talking about. That favorite sweater with the worn out elbows, Popi's favorite chair with the missing leg now supported by a brick, that old television whose volume could not be adjusted, all these items needed to be discarded. However, throwing these things away was an experience filled with sadness and discontent because it required of us a change from the way we typically viewed the world, and it pushed us away from things which gave us comfort. Many of us find it difficult to step out of our comfort zones and yet our Christian faith requires that we go that extra mile ultimately for the greater glory of God.

Believe it or not, the Easter season, just like the lingering chilly weather, will soon be over. The challenge for us now is to do some spring cleaning in preparation for the change. We won't throw out the joy and excitement of serving the risen Lord, nor will we allow things to return to the way they have always been. Today's word from the book of Revelation articulates in a profound way what we should each be feeling. Individually and collectively we

are part of that "new heaven and new earth" as we acknowledge the former things have passed away, now that Christ is risen from the grave. John wrote: "The one who sits on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new, for the old order has passed away." Our Catholic faith displays an incredible beauty in the fact that the Mass is a celebration offered each day, at every hour of the day, somewhere on earth, in different languages and yet it essentially is recognizable because of the specific parameters within which it is celebrated. Repeatedly you have heard me say that we don't use graham crackers and coke for the Mass, but bread and wine, which are transubstantiated into the body and blood of Christ. It therefore only makes sense that when we come forward to receive Christ, we should make the reverential gesture of bowing or genuflecting before we approach. As the priest, deacon, or extra-ordinary minister offers the Blessed Sacrament by the specific words, "The body of Christ", not "Joe Jones, or Sally Star, the body of Christ, our singular response should be "Amen". The point I'm making is that if you can hear the minister state, "The body of Christ", he or she should be able to hear you respond, "Amen". These simple gestures, responses, and communal processions are each part of the Catholic expression of unity during the liturgy of the Eucharist. Unlike our brothers and sister of other Christian denominations who show unity by holding hands during the Our Father, Roman Catholics display communion by the aforementioned actions while receiving the "source and summit" of our faith, the very body and blood of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Additionally, during the Liturgy of the Word, it is not necessary for the Lectors to add phrases such as, "The first reading", or "the second reading" or even "the responsorial psalm, is from". Please Lectors, just read what is written in the Lectionary, for example: "A reading from the book of Revelation". Not "The second reading is from the book of Revelation". It is time we did some "spring cleaning" in regard to the manner in which we celebrate the Mass. I will be making a profound effort to have a meeting for the Lectors and Extra-Ordinary ministers in the upcoming weeks. Altar servers and those now eligible to serve following the reception of first communion will also

soon be required to meet with me. In the meantime please reflect on the following from the Vatican documents: "The sacrament should not be received out of routine, vainglory, or concern for human respect". In another document a priest wrote: "We are not Christians for what we can get out of Christianity. We are Christians so we can give God honor and glory". AMDG
